The February 12th meeting will feature a Harris County Sheriff's Forum for the Republican candidates. You will not want to miss this event! **All four candidates are scheduled to attend: Glenn Cowan, Joe Danna, Paul Day, and Mike Knox. The forum will be moderated by The Honorable Sam Harless.** This will give our members the opportunity to hear from the Republican candidates in order to vote in the March primary and elect the best Republican able to win in November.

Glenn Cowan. Sergeant Cowan is a Police Supervisor for Houston Police Department. He has a master's degree in criminal justice from Tarleton State University and is pursuing a doctoral degree. He holds a certification in mental health crisis intervention. He and his wife have been married for 26 years and are parents of triplets.

Joe Danna. Mr. Danna is a Master Police Officer with Precinct 1 Constable's Office. He authorized the very first TXDOT STEP Program.

Paul Day. Mr. Day is a Senior Police Officer for the North Command Patrol. He has over 45 years of law enforcement experience. He is a US Army veteran and has training in Hostage Negotiations and Crisis Intervention. He holds a bachelor's degree from University of Buffalo, NY.

Mike Knox. Mr. Knox is a US Air Force veteran. He helped with the creation of the first Divisional Gang Unit for the Houston Police Department. From 2016 to January 2024, he served on the Houston City Council. He holds a bachelor's degree from University of Houston-Downtown.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE *Nancy Radcliffe*

Have you ever wondered how to get your candidate of choice elected or exactly which Republican to support during a primary election? Several good ways are to look at a list of the candidates, see if you know any of the candidates personally, listen to reliable friends, ask questions of candidates at meetings, read items sent by candidates, and attend candidate gatherings. Once you've decided, contact the candidate's campaign and see if there is anything you can do to help. It may include making some phone calls (generally scripted), holding a sign at a voting location during early voting and on election day, putting out a sign in your yard, hosting a small gathering in your home, and doing whatever will help to get your candidate's message out to the public.



How will NWFRW help? Federated clubs are restricted from endorsing candidates in contested primary races. It's a "fairness" thing to keep each candidate in a primary on a level playing field. Once the primary is held, the club will back the Republican candidate who has won.

To assist our members in making a decision for Harris County Sheriff, NWFRW is hosting a candidates' forum during our general meeting on February 12th. All four Republican candidates have agreed to be present to tell us about themselves and answers questions. This is truly an opportunity to be "up close and personal" with these individuals who want to win the important position of helping restore safety to our county. All one must do is read or watch the news to know that crime and safety are a major concern throughout the county, including the communities where we live. We are expecting a full house, so please make your reservation for this event no later than February 9th at 9:00 AM. The voter registration committee for NWFRW has been working diligently getting members trained to be Harris County Volunteer Deputy Voter Registrars for upcoming voter registration drives. They are also in the process of organizing these voter registration drives throughout the county. It is critical to help citizens exercise their right to vote, and our club has taken this project on as a major priority for this year. We will also be implementing GOTV (Get-out-the-Vote) initiatives as the year progresses. Please let any board member or me know if you are interested in being involved. We need YOU!

President Nancy Radcliffe called the NWFRW General Meeting to order on Monday, January 8, 2024, at 11:30 AM. **Linda LeCroy** (for Chaplain Cindy Eschenburg) gave the invocation. **The Honorable Sam Harless** led the pledges to the American and Texas flags.

President Nancy Radcliffe thanked Representative Harless for leading the pledges. She introduced the new officers and board members for 2024. Nancy reminded everyone of our motto for this year: **"Unite! Soar in '24!"** There will be many opportunities to volunteer during this election year, including voter registrations, candidate campaign work, putting out yard signs, making phone calls, and preparing for our club's 50th Anniversary in June. She also mentioned the TFRW Leadership Training Day.

3rd VP Political Activities/Lauren Lothringer introduced the elected officials, their representatives, and future election candidates. She also asked for all veterans to stand and be recognized.

1st VP Programs/Marcia Fitzpatrick introduced the speaker, Texas Railroad Commissioner Wayne Christian. Commissioner Christian spoke about the great danger oil and gas is in, focusing on Texas. If President Biden ends fossil fuels, Texas will lose 40% of its income which comes from oil, gas, and coal production. Texas supplies 50% of the oil in the United States.

LUNCH

Minutes from the NWFRW December 11, 2023, general meeting were approved as printed in the *Potpourri* and will be filed with the secretary.

Treasurer/Lisa Migl gave the Treasurer's Report, and it will be filed with the minutes.

PAC Treasurer/Gaynell Lira gave the PAC Treasurer's Report, and it will be filed with the minutes.

1st VP Programs/Marcia Fitzpatrick reported that the February 12th General Meeting will feature a forum for the Republican candidates running for Harris County Sheriff. The candidates are Glen Cowan, Joe Danna, Paul Day, and Mike Knox. The Forum will be moderated by the Honorable Sam Harless and will allow our members to hear from the candidates to elect the best Republican to win in November.

Save the Date: NWFRW will be going on a Field Trip! The Precinct 3 Bus will take us to the Bush Presidential Library and Museum on Friday, April 5th. Watch for more details and sign-up next month.

2nd VP Membership/Kathy Mason welcomed the 20 guests at the meeting, encouraging them to join for 2024. Annual membership is \$45, and associate membership is \$30. If you pay with a credit card, there is a nominal fee. However, cash or a check is still needed to pay for a meal at Shirley Acres. To date we have 161 primary members and 28 associate members, bringing the total to 189. 3RD VP/POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

Our January meeting was a great kick-off to a busy year ahead! Jumping straight into things ... Harris County GOP has reluctantly agreed to a joint election for the Primary. **What does this mean? For the first time in Harris County history, Republican and Democrat voters will cast ballots using the same equipment at the same polling sites for the Primary Election. Due to SB 924, all parties agreed that it is required under this new law to hold a joint election. This is not ideal, and Republicans need to be more prepared than ever to get out and vote.**

Please mark these important dates on your calendar:

- The last day to register to vote is Monday, Feb 5th.
- The first day of early voting is Tuesday, Feb 20th.
- The last day of early voting is Friday, March 1st.
- Election day is Tuesday, March 5th, which is also the last day to receive ballot by mail.

Every year, eligible voters must reapply for their ballot by mail under Texas law. This includes those who are disabled or 65 or older and are eligible to vote using a ballot by mail under Texas law.

The law allows eligible voters to submit an "annual" application, meaning they will receive a ballot by mail for all the 2024 elections in the area where the voter lives. Even if you received a ballot in the mail in 2023, you must reapply now that it is 2024. You can request a mail-in ballot by calling 713-755-6965 or emailing harrisvotes.com for an application for a mail-in ballot.

Sample ballots are not yet available but will be soon. You may visit What's on my Ballot? (harrisvotes.com) to see what is on your specific ballot when they become available. Take the time now to educate yourself on all candidates so you may vote confidently in the primaries!

Lastly, be sure to turn in your volunteer hours. The guidelines for counting hours can be found on Page 7 in the Directory. As a club, we logged 2,371 hours for the 4th quarter. We must continue working hard to keep Texas **RED** and turn Harris County **RED** again.

Stay informed... **Unite! Soar in '24!**

I am honored to serve on the 2024 Northwest Forest Republican Women board as Legislative Chair. As you know, 2023 was a busy year for Texas lawmakers with many bills passed during the 88th legislative session – including the regular session in the spring to special sessions in the fall. Thirty new laws went into effect on January 1, 2024. Here is an overview of a few of those laws:

SB3 – Property tax relief. The franchise tax exemption will double, allowing up to \$2.47 million of an entity’s total taxable revenue to be exempted from franchise taxes. As a result, 67,000 small and medium-sized businesses will no longer have to pay the franchise tax and will not have to file a franchise tax return.

HB614 – Property owners’ associations will be required to adopt a formal and transparent policy on how they levy fines and other violations against property owners. The policy must include general categories or restrictive covenants for which the association may assess fines, a schedule of fines for each category of violation, and information regarding hearings. The associations will be required to send each property owner a copy of their policies and post them on their website.

SB17– This new law prohibits higher education institutions from funding or supporting Diversity, Equity and Inclusion offices. The bill also bans assigning employees or contracting third parties to perform the duties of a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion office, as well as banning required DEI training.

HB4758 – The Protecting Children from Electronic Cigarette Advertising Act. Creates a Class B misdemeanor offense for marketing, advertising, selling, or causing to be sold an e-cigarette product, including any substance containing nicotine from any source that is intended for use in an e-cigarette, in certain containers that are designed to appeal to minors. This includes containers showing a cartoon-like character that mimics a character primarily aimed at entertaining minors, an image of a celebrity, and images that resemble a food product, including candy or juice.

SB10 – Texas Senate Bill 10 gives members of the Texas Teacher Retirement System a cost-of-living adjustment. Voters then approved the COLA as Proposition 9 at the November 7 election. Proposition 9 authorizes a one-time COLA between 2% and 6%, depending on when the teacher retired.

HB2323 – The Legislature approved the issuance of a new specialty license plate as a nod to the 100th anniversary of the writing of the Texas state song, “Texas, Our Texas.” The license plate will include the words “Texas, Our Texas” and the dates “1924-2024.”
