MINUTES, February 9, 2026

Susan Thompson

Call to Order. President Lauren Lothringer Maywald called the NWFRW General Meeting to order at approximately 11:30 AM on Monday, February 9, 2026.

Invocation was provided by Chaplain Tracie Anderson.

Pledges to the American and Texas Flags were led by Constable Mark Herman.

Welcome. 3rd VP Political Activities Marcia Fitzpatrick greeted, then introduced elected officials, candidates and their representatives and welcomed all military veterans, guests and members of other clubs.

Meeting Program. 1st VP Programs Paige Harr introduced Representative Tom Oliverson, Texas HD 130, who discussed the importance of the mid-term election. He advised members to vote in the primary election, attend the state convention (see Announcements) and vote in the November election. Candidates for Texas' 2nd Congressional District Dan Crenshaw and Michael Toth also made brief comments.

LUNCH

Approval of the Minutes. The minutes of the NWFRW January 12, 2026, General Meeting were approved as printed in the Potpourri and will be filed with the secretary.

Treasurer Amy Uribe gave the Treasurer's report, and it will be filed with the minutes.

PAC Treasurer Gaynell Lira gave the PAC Treasurer's report, and it will be filed with the minutes.

1st VP Programs Paige Harr announced that Representatives from Camp Hope and perhaps Camp Shield will be the featured speakers at the general meeting on March 9, 2026.

2nd VP Membership Kathy Crosby reported that the Club was working to retain its super jumbo status for 2026 and requested that membership applications be submitted by March 1 to be included in the 2026 directory; memberships received after the deadline will be included in an addendum later in the year. She also encouraged extending invitations to friends. 2nd VP Crosby also pointed out information included at each table regarding the upcoming Candidate Meet & Greet (see Announcements) which will be a come-and-go event with the opportunity to talk directly to candidates. The event is open to all members, and since space is limited an RSVP no later than Feb. 12 is encouraged.

3rd VP Political Activities Marcia Fitzpatrick noted that the upcoming Meet & Greet is a good opportunity to meet with Republican candidates prior to voting in the primary election. She announced the list of candidates that are expected to attend the event and provided key voting dates:

- Primary Early Voting: February 17-27
- Primary Election Date: March 3
- Election Day: November 3

Scholarship Co-Chair Nicole Peters announced that applications for the Priscilla Petty Scholarship (\$1,500) are being accepted until March 31. Applicants must be a female graduating from a Texas high school in 2026 with plans to attend a four-year accredited university.

March 9th is NWFRW's annual **CAMP HOPE DAY!** There will be **TWO** Camp Hope tables at the March Meeting in celebration of this special non-profit organization that assists Combat Veterans from all five branches of the military. **Let's overflow these tables with both in-kind and monetary donations to show our gratitude for these men and their families!** When the veterans see the donations, they see much more than paper towels, cleaning supplies, and hygiene products. They see they are appreciated and valued!

The total amount of donations given to Camp Hope by Northwest Forest Republican Women's Club in 2025 was \$4,806.94. This total includes in-kind and monetary donations combined. If each of us makes bringing donations a monthly routine, this amount might be doubled in 2026!

There is still time to Early Vote until Feb 27th in the primary elections. **Election Day is Tuesday, March 3rd.** Be sure to vote as early as you can... Life happens, and there is always the weather!

The goal is to get the **BEST** Republicans elected in order to win in November. If your candidate doesn't make it though the primary, it is important to support the winner and help get them elected in November. Remember there are 10 Propositions on the Republican ballot. Be sure to vote down the entire ballot. Those propositions are included at the end of the newsletter for review.

The Precinct Conventions will be held Saturday, March 7th. Registration starts at 8:00 AM. If your Precinct is in HD 126, you will meet at Glorious Way Church, 11611 Champion Forest Dr., Houston TX 77066, and if your Precinct is in HD 150 you will meet at Spring Baptist Church, 633 E. Louetta Rd. Spring TX 77273. **In order to attend the Precinct Convention, you will need to have voted in the Primary. Also, bring your Voter Registration Card.**

If you want to be a delegate or alternate delegate to the Republican Party of Texas (RPT) State Convention held this coming June in Houston, you must attend both the Precinct and Senate Conventions. Additional information about both the Precinct and Senate Conventions is located at the end of the newsletter.

DOWNLOAD SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Texas legislature remains in the interim period between the 89h Regular Session and the 90h Regular Session which starts in January 2027. As of February 2026, there are no active floor sessions; but leadership has begun assigning interim charges to committees for study and potential recommendations ahead of 2027 legislation. Topics for analysis include preventing influences from Sharia law, expanding property tax relief (referred to as "Operation Double Nickel"), addressing government fraud and abuse, improving the power grid, and promoting a Texas-first agenda. Public hearings will provide opportunities for input from groups like Republican women's organizations on family, education, and economic issues. Interim committee hearings generally pick up momentum in spring and summer (April–July 2026).

All 150 Texas House seats and multiple Senate seats are up for election in November 2026, with Republicans currently holding an 88-62 House majority. However, a recent Democratic upset in a special election has raised concerns among Republicans about voter turnout and messaging ahead of the midterms.

Republicans aim to unify post-special election losses, boost turnout, and leverage issues like border security, taxes, and education choice. Primaries could preview November vulnerabilities if divisions persist. Turnout will be crucial—the recent special election upsets underscore suburban/Latino voter risks.

Early Voting for the primary elections started on February 17th, with Election Day being on March 3rd. A list of the 2026 Primary Ballot Propositions are included at the end of the newsletter, as they will appear on your ballot. Please read and be prepared to vote YES or NO on each. These propositions represent the opinions of Texas Republican voters and will help shape the republican priorities for the next legislative session.

Stay united, informed, and engaged—Republican women voices matter more than ever in shaping Texas' future. Whether it is championing school choice, securing Texas borders, protecting women's sports, or delivering real tax relief, powerful Republican leadership starts with strong turnout and principled choices at the ballot box.



2026 Primary Ballot Propositions



Propositions are an opinion poll of Republican voters and not a policy referendum. You are not voting to make a law but merely saying YES you agree or NO you do not agree with the statement.



Proposition 1

Texas property taxes should be assessed at the purchase price and phased out entirely over the next six years through spending reductions.

Proposition 2

Texas should require any local government budget that raises property taxes to be approved by voters at a November general election.

Proposition 3

Texas should prohibit denial of healthcare or any medical service based solely on the patient's vaccination status.

Proposition 4

Texas should require its public schools to teach that life begins at fertilization.

Proposition 5

Texas should ban gender, sexuality, and reproductive clinics and services in K-12 schools.

Proposition 6

Texas should enact term limits on all elected officials.

Texas should ban the large-scale export or sale of our groundwater and surface water to any single private or public entity.

Proposition 8

The Texas Legislature should reduce the burden of illegal immigration on taxpayers by ending public services for illegal aliens.

Proposition 9

The Republican-controlled Texas Legislature should stop awarding leadership positions, including committee and subcommittee chairmanships and vice chairmanships, to Democrats.

Texas should prohibit Sharia Law.
